#### **Seminar Papers**

 Reading reaction papers 1-2 pages due each week in seminar. This short but serious assignment reviews reading content, focuses thoughts for discussion, and practices formal writing skills.
 Typewritten, double-spaced, grammar and spelling.

## **Integration Blog**

– Short weekend reflections due online each week by 10 am Monday mornings. This assignment encourages students to review academic themes and work experience, practice free writing, and communicate personal insights and ideas.

#### **Reference Websites**

– Interns will work as a single team on a series of shared website assignments. There will be three assignments, due for presentation in Weeks 4, 7 and 10. In each case, students will construct a website to serve as a comprehensive and reliable general reference tool for a specific topic. Topics will be chosen from the humanities, science and law on the first day of class. Development of each site will be supported with classroom instruction in library research methods and reference strategies for the general fields of the topics.

Presentations – Interns present reference websites in Wks 4, 7, 10.
