ABOUT THESE DATA

The following table shows figures on the race and ethnicity of full-time faculty members at more than 2,700 colleges and universities for the fall of 2005.

The table is limited to public and private nonprofit degree-granting institutions that have 20 or more full-time faculty members. It covers two-year and four-year institutions in the 50 states and Washington, D.C.

The figures in the table are from the U.S. Education Department's Fall Staff Survey, which is part of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System. Results of the survey were released this spring.

The staff survey is conducted in odd-numbered years. It includes only institutions with 15 or more full-time employees.

The full titles of the racial and ethnic categories are: white non-Hispanic; black non-Hispanic; Hispanic; Asian or Pacific Islander; American Indian or Alaska Native; and race/ethnicity unknown. Those six categories include both U.S. citizens and resident aliens. The category of "nonresident alien" covers those of all racial and ethnic groups who are in the United States on a visa or temporary basis and do not have the right to remain indefinitely. A person may be counted in only one group.

For each institution the percentage minority is shown. The percentage is calculated as follows: The sum of American Indian, Asian, black, and Hispanic faculty members is divided by the total minus the amount categorized as race unknown. The percentage is rounded to the nearest whole number. If more than 25 percent of an institution's faculty members are in the category of race unknown, a dash is shown in the "percentage minority" column.

$$\text{Percentage minority} = \frac{\text{American Indian} + \text{Asian} + \text{Black} + \text{Hispanic}}{\text{Total} - \text{Race unknown}}$$
